South Punjab business community comes together to shine on PBIT helpdesk inauguration

Amidst the pandemic blues, some bright light of hope is finally shining upon the forgotten land of South Punjab. To facilitate the southern Punjab business community and to promote the rewarding profitability of this region, Punjab Board of Investment and Trade came together with Multan Chamber of Commerce and Industry and established a "PBIT South Punjab Helpdesk" in chamber building.

In order to smoothen the way for local businesses, The Chairman Punjab Board of Investment & Trade expressed his desire for establishing the helpdesks at the local chambers of commerce and industry at every major city of Punjab. Speaking on the occasion, Sardar Tanveer Ilyas Khan said that this was the first time in history that all leading chambers of commerce and industry including women bodies from eight leading districts across south Punjab came together and participated in this unique opportunity to uplift the economic outlook of this region. He said that now PBIT will work for the establishment of women specific economic zone in this region, which would empower the women presence in business climate of Pakistan.

Vivo starts smartphone manufacturing in Pakistan

Pakistan has started local manufacturing of mobile phones as Chinese tech giant Vivo has officially started producing smartphones in Punjab.

Situated in M-3 Industrial Estate in Faisalabad and built with a USD 10 million investment, Vivo will cater the smartphone needs of the country where currently there is a demand for 32 million phones and a total of \$1 billion in spending on imports, annually.

Provincial Minister ICI&SDD Mian Aslam Iqbal while sharing the update said, "Made in Pakistan Mobiles are a reality now. Mobile's Faisalabad Economic Zone facility has started production of smartphones and more companies are to follow soon InshaAllah."





Shifting production in Pakistan will help Vivo offer better price points in the market and further strengthening the company's position in South Asia. Currently Vivo has a total of 29 PTA approved facilities, out of which 17 are operational, and 3 of them are smartphone assemblers. The company has also teased that more brands will follow suit soon.

The Mobile Device Manufacturing Policy provides great incentives making Pakistan ripe for potential investments. PBIT facilitated the said company for getting incentives as a zone enterprise in the Special Economic Zone and land acquisition approvals.

USAID, in collaboration with PBIT, hosts private sector engagement forum in South Punjab



The United States Mission to Pakistan along with the Punjab Government opened a three-day private sector forum, "South Punjab Virtual PSE Forum" to identify opportunities and challenges for commercial and social investments in the region.

The "South Punjab Virtual Private Sector Engagement Forum" was organized by the United States Agency for International Development's (USAID) Punjab Enabling Environment Project (PEEP) in partnership with Punjab Board of Investment and Trade through the USAID Lahore Office in collaboration with the South Punjab private sector.

The forum focused on four key sectors: agriculture, tourism, textiles, and energy. One of the main topics was identifying the challenges for growth of the private sector in South Punjab, including market access constraints exacerbated by COVID-19 mobility limitations. Other topics included lack of innovation in agriculture practices and crop value chains, the widening knowledge gap in agriculture enterprises, and access to finance for smallholders.

The U.S. Consul General Lahore, Additional Chief Secretary for South Punjab Zahid Akhtar Zaman, CEO PBIT Dr. Erfa Iqbal, Dr. Asif Ali, Vice



Chancellor, MNS-University of Agriculture, Multan, Ali Afzal, Head of Corporate, South CIBG, The Bank of Punjab, and representatives from Grace Solar, Systems LTD, U.S. International Development Finance Corporation as well as Chambers and Associations operational in South Punjab attended the virtual forum.

CEO Punjab Board of Investment and Trade, Dr. Erfa Iqbal were the speaker in opening plenary session and made a presentation on "Punjab as a potential investment hub with a special focus on South Punjab. speaking on the situational analysis, she highlighted that despite having abundant labor force, Southern Punjab, like the rest of Pakistan, suffers from a mismatch between trained workers and the needs of industry, creating a

scenario in which the industry suffers from a labor force with low productivity. She underscored the need for planned, market-based skill development in the region.

Highlighting the potential for industrialization in the region, she shared that sector wise Investment Corridors may be established in various districts across South Punjab to support the local industry and to boost exports and reduce imports for the uplift of the economy of Pakistan. In this context, she gave a detailed presentation on Multan, D.G Khan, Bahawalpur and Sahiwal Divisions, their ingenious industry and future potential investment corridors.

She also shared opportunities in tourism sector and service industry with the participants, encouraging the private and public sector to share their projects with Punjab Board of Investment and Trade for showcasing to the foreign investors across the globe.

Chairman Punjab Board of Investment and Trade and Special Assistant to Chief Minister on Trade, Business and Investment Sardar Tanveer Ilyas Khan were the speaker in closing session. He said in his remarks that briefed that Government of the Punjab envisions public-private partnership to develop the capacity of agribusinesses in Southern Punjab whose economy is mainly agriculture based. He added that supply chains in the Southern Punjab may be digitized to overcome challenges of physical proximity to urban centers and banks. He shared that the region also presented ample opportunities for digitization in agriculture and textiles sectors and leveraging digital shared economy such as uber for tractors. Agreement signed: Punjab Board of Investment and Trade and the Punjab Information Technology Board (PITB)

Punjab Board of Investment and Trade and the Punjab Information Technology Board (PITB) have inked a contact centre services agreement to establish an investor helpline.

The agreement was duly signed by the Chief Operating Officer PBIT Jalal Hassan and Sajid Latif DG e-Governance PITB, while Chief Executive Officer Punjab Board of Investment and Trade Dr Erfa Iqbal, Joint Director Citizen Contact Centre Ali Zeb, and other team members of the organisations were present.



According to the agreement, a citizen contact centre will handle inquiries and complaints and will also establish an online portal for PBIT which shall be maintained in parallel and synchronisation to the telephone-based helpline.

Under this agreement, Punjab Information Technology Board will provide assistance to Punjab Board of Investment & Trade in feedback calls through holistic call centre service during specified timings and will also provide CRM access to PBIT through user login and other credentials.

Together Punjab Board of Investment and Trade and Punjab Information Technology Board will be able to facilitate investors both local and foreign and to brand Punjab as an ideal destination for investments due to its liberal investment regime and rising economic opportunities.

(Continued from page 5) US Consul General in Lahore, Catherine Rodriguez said that recognizing investment gaps, formulating common strategies, and establishing a broad framework to enhance investments will go a long way in helping develop South Punjab.

"We understand the hurdles impeding the economic growth of the region but through joint efforts with the Government of Punjab, and major public and private sector partners, we can overcome these impediments," said USAID/Pakistan Mission Director Julie Koenen, who participated in the closing session at the end of the forum on January 28.

Additional Chief Secretary for South Punjab Zahid Akhtar Zaman represented the Punjab government and delivered remarks focusing on the Punjab government's vision for the region. More than 100 participants from the public and private sector also attended the virtual plenary session.

It was shared with the participants that USAID's PEEP program has also established sustainable initiatives to address a number of challenges in the South Punjab, including the absence of academia-industry linkages for technology-driven research and development, and access to finance and markets.
